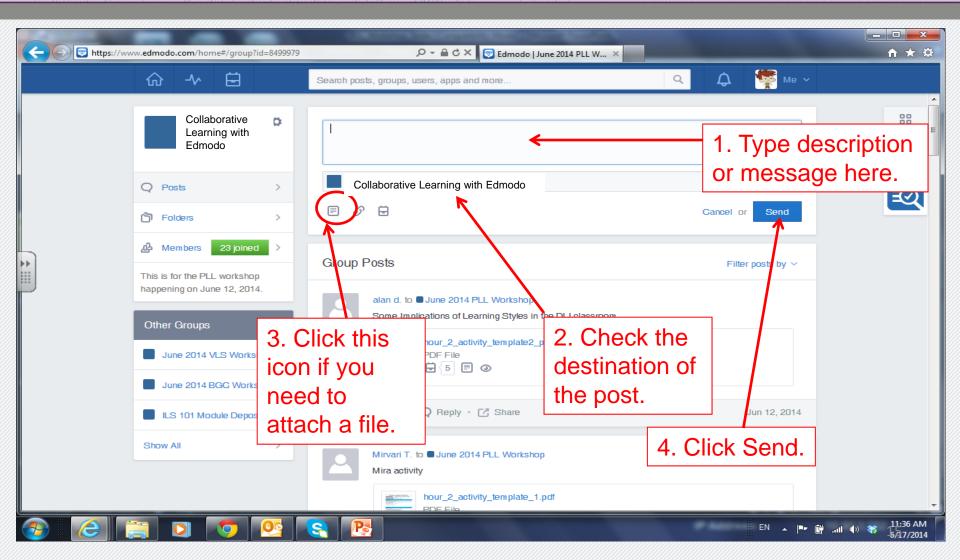

Simple Tools

- Posting a message to your assigned group members
- Downloading files from a folder and a file attachment from a post
- Posting collaborative works in a specific group by file attachment
- Posting comments/questions/responses in/for the big group (class)

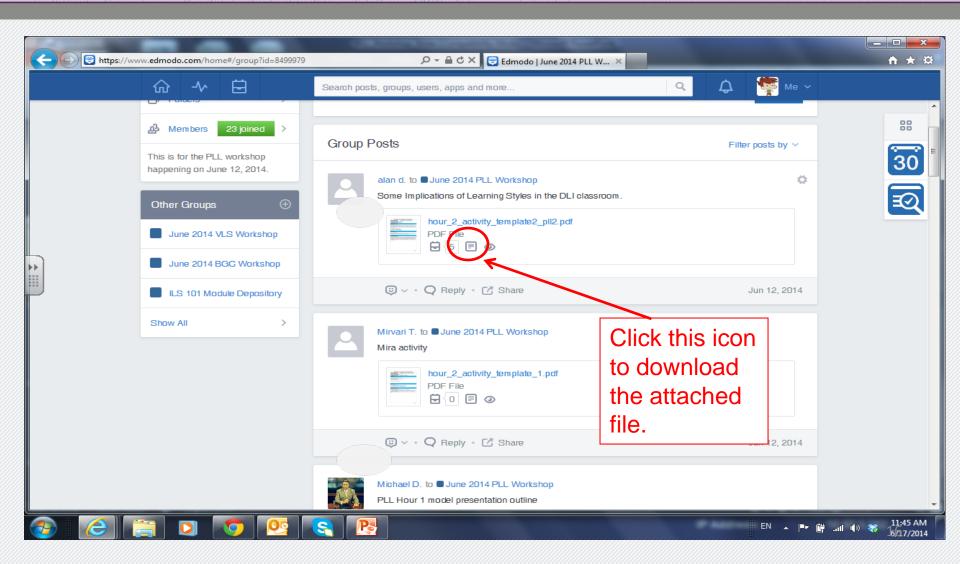


EDMODO Key Features: Posting messages in Assigned Group



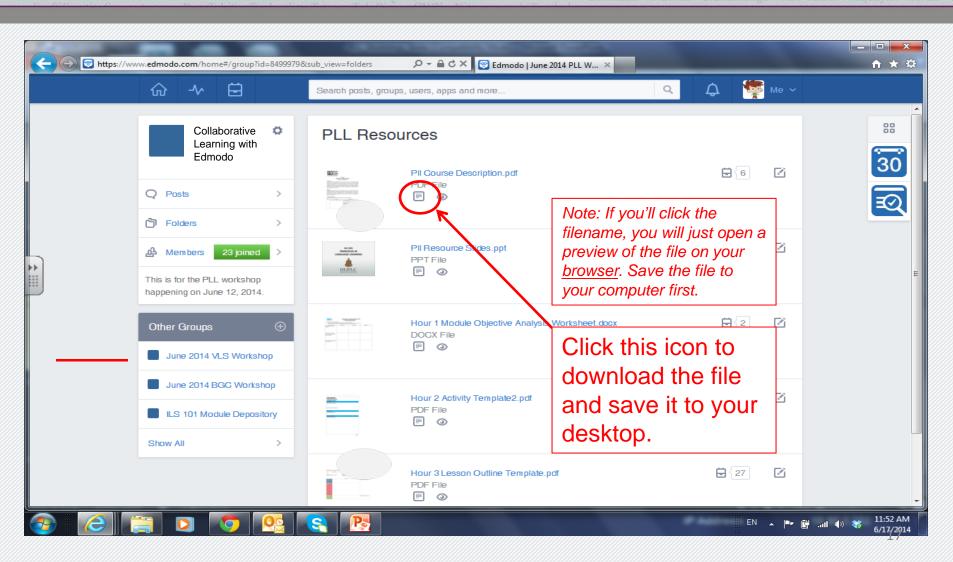


EDMODO Key Features: Downloading files from posts






How to download a file from a folder in Edmodo
