- Write 8-week curriculum in 3-4 weeks? No way!




Counter-Crunch!

- 2. HOTS: handle with care
- 3. Time Flex: conquer LOTS, then on to HOTS

Groan Zone

-Little familiarity
-Risky & uncomfortable

Comfort Zone

- -Most familiar
- -Maintenance of old patterns
- -A lot of anxiety
 -Temptation to return
 to old ways
- -Integration of skill into daily lifestyles
- -Feelings of mastery, accomplishment and familiarity
