



## Welcome to the Utah Partnerships for Turning Data into Action | A Health Data Innovation Summit

Welcome to the Utah Public Health System's first Health Data Innovation Summit hosted in collaboration with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the CDC Foundation. This invitation-only event brings together key partners to learn about, and collaborate on, high priority public health information challenges that impact the health, wellness, and prosperity of Utahns. The summit will convene distinguished representatives from the public and private sectors to consider catalytic opportunities to unlock and modernize essential public health information that can be used by communities, families, businesses, and government for better, faster decision making. These opportunities will focus on how multi-sector partnerships can drive innovation in health data information systems – innovations that ultimately help improve health outcomes, lower healthcare costs, and spur economic growth for every Utahn. This inaugural summit also offers an important model for unlocking the value and impact of health information. The partnership model can be used by national, state, and local partners to transform how health information serves the public's health, communities, and diverse sectors.

This event will include presentations by Utah Public Health Systems, CDC, and key partners, with opportunities for discussion and questions.

Building on February's CDC-ONC Industry Days, this two-day event will accomplish several goals, including:

- Highlight the role of the One Utah Health Collaborative,
- Learn how public health data can better serve diverse sectors,
- Showcase plans for the Common Public Health Data Platform project a shared data space across Utah's local public health agencies,
- Promote Utah's Electronic Case Reporting (eCR) system development, implementation, and collaboration opportunities,
- Inform partners about the Utah public health agencies' strategic direction, major areas of work, and priorities,
- Provide partners with opportunities to describe their services,
- Feature a panel of leaders from across sectors,
- Provide networking opportunities.

We will collect the information learned during this event to inform future collaborations and to receive feedback and input as we work to unlock the value and impact of health information in Utah.
